



Agrobiodiversity.net is a platform. The website will communicate contacts to individual national organisations and link different activities in Europe. National, regional and European networks are listed that are active for the conservation of agricultural genetic resources – agrobiodiversity.

Partners of the SAVE-Network can use <u>www.agrobiodiversity.net</u> for their presentation, i.e. there is the possibility to include a short text, logo, address and link to their own homepage. The menu prompt is simple, pages are clearly laid out, country maps allow geographical choice. <u>www.agrobiodiversity.net</u> informs about cross-border regional projects such as Balkan Network or the planned activities in the Carpathians region. Agrobiodiversity.net is only starting, the number of pages is still small, but upgrading in all directions is possible. Agrobiodiversity knows no bounds – the same applies to our website!

Workshop "Network of Rare Livestock Breeds in Greece"

The MAVA Project "Animal genetic resources in Greece" has entered a new phase: A second workshop took place from 18th to 20th May 2006 in Agrinion in Western Greece. During the first workshop in summer 2005 in Athens, the exchange of information and experiences was most important to initiate networking (cf. SAVE eNews 3/2005). In Agrinion, the most important aim was to link the private sector – NGOs and individual persons.

Particularly in Greek areas of high ecological value, freely grazing livestock such as old cattle or horse breeds can still be found. Therefore, particular attention was turned to representatives from nature protection during the preparation of the workshop. The 25 participants of the workshop – from organisations active for the conservation of individual breeds and engaged individuals, joined up: After the situation and development



since summer 2005 was presented and discussed, a working group started to evaluate the possibilities to found a network. A second working group discussed conservation strategies, such as the necessity of herdbooks, several monitoring aspects, necessary projects, rescue operations and activities. The results of the workshops are published under

After intensive discussions of both working groups, a decision was made that is of historical importance for the conservation of endangered livestock breeds in Greece: On May 19th 2006, the foundation stone was laid for the establishment of **AMALTHIA**, "Greek Society for the Conservation of Indigenous Breeds of Domestic Animals". Statutes were discussed and the 7 founder members required by Greece legislation to hand in the statutes at court met quickly. In order to be able to found an organisation

that has legal capacity, it is required that 21 members register. This hurdle was taken quickly. Even a logo has already been defined: the horns of the Ulokeratiki goat (photo); the breed has recently been rescued from extinction.

Amalthia, a synonym for cornucopia, is a goat from Mythology. Zeus, the Greek god whom she had nurtured, gave her horn magical properties: it was always filled with everything her owner wished. We wish Amalthia a permanently filled horn with energy, persistence and engagement for the conservation of endangered livestock breeds in Greece.

SAVE Annual Meeting 2006 in Bad-Sooden/Allendorf

Within the frame of the "Hessentag", a fair by the German Federal county of Hesse, the "Gesellschaft zur Erhaltung alter und gefährdeter Haustierrassen e. V." (GEH) (engl: German Society for the conservation of old and endangered livestock breeds) celebrated its 25th anniversary. For that reason, SAVE Foundation and the SAVE Network hold their annual meeting at Whitsun from 2nd to 4th June 2006 in Bad Sooden-Allendorf, Germany. Within the frame of the accompanying programme, many old livestock breeds taken care of by the GEH could be seen at the "Hessentag".

One-World-Garden

The introduction to the SAVE Annual Meeting 2006 was very exotic: The project "Eine-Welt-Garten" (One-World-Garden) of the Tropical Greenhouse of the University of Kassel shows more than 380 cultivated plants from all over the world. The project aims to demonstrate clearly how strongly the Western World is linked to the Tropics and that several cultivated plants changed the world dramatically.



GEH Ark Farms

GEH, SAVE partner organisation of the early beginnings, presented its "Archehof" (Ark Farm) concept: In 1995, the first farm received the GEH Archehof label. Since then, criteria for Ark Farms were continuously revised and adjusted. Altogether, more than 70 farms have been approved as Archehof by the GEH. The farm have to meet a demanding catalogue of criteria and they are regularly visited and controlled by Archehof coordinator that is regularly controlled. Furthermore, Archehof farmers are invited to a training workshop annually. Training of co-ordinators and other actors is done regularly. The concept is well established in Germany. The interest of farmers to be approved as "Archehof" is great. The label guarantees an acknowledgement of breeding work, increase of name recognition, and better marketing of breeding animals and products from old livestock breed.

GEH Animal Show

When visiting the above mentioned animal show of the GEH, the broad spectrum of GEH activities was colourfully demonstrated. 16 sheep breeds, 2 got breeds, 4 pig breeds, 6 cattle breeds, 2 horse breeds, 2 rabbit breeds and 2 chicken breeds, one bee bred and 4 dog breeds in different colour types were exhibited and could be admired. In the arena, a miscellaneous programme included the behaviour and tasks of shepherd dogs as well as draught activities with cattle. The visiting public could observe the broad spectrum of utilisation of old breeds

Migratory Sheep Farming in the Nature Park "Hoher Meissner"

The SAVE Annual meeting was concluded by an excursion to the Nature Park "Hoher Meissner" in Northern Hesse. In the park, a migrating shepherd who also keeps and breeds Leinesheep, an old regional sheep breed, is active. The relation between con-



servation of diversity in nature protection and grazing with old livestock breeds can well be observed in the Nature Park "Hoher Meissner". Gobe Flower and Arnica are the most recent proof that traditional migratory sheep farming contributes actively to conserve and extend botanical species diversity. Particularly the strongly endangered juniper heath lands are revived through migratory sheep farming.

Elections and Decisions

This year, the renewal of committees for the next three-years term of office was on the agenda of the annual meeting of the SAVE Foundation and the European SAVE Network. In the Board of Directors, three resignations were replaced by Jean-Emmanuel Eglin (France), Antje Feldmann (Germany) und Sergej Ivanov (Serbia). In the Project Commission, four resignations were replaced by Tibor Baranec (Slovakia), Boris Krska (Czech Republic), Geesje Kuit (The Netherlands), Wieslaw Podyma (Poland), Ullrich Schulze (Germany) und Borut Stumberger (Slovenia). We cordially welcome the "new-comers" and thank all the former members very much for their work.

Product marketing and the production of quality products is becoming more and more important for the economic conservation of endangered livestock and cultivated plants. It was therefore concluded to organise an international workshop on Labelling and Product marketing (presumably beginning of 2007).

The next SAVE Annual Meeting will take place from 28th to 30th September 2007 in Guastalla (Italy), within the frame of a RARE congress during the Italian fair for organic products.
