## Animal Genetic Resources in Greece: Monitoring of endangered livestock breeds is completed

The project "Animal Genetic Resources in Greece – Monitoring and Conservation of Rare Livestock Breeds" was carried out from 2004-2006 with the friendly support of the MAVA-Foundation for Nature Protection, Montricher, Switzerland. The present situation, need for action and possibilities for in-situ conservation of autochthonous livestock breeds was recorded. The report shows the still enormous extend of livestock diversity in Greece, considering both breeds and types. On numerous islands, in remote mountain areas and border regions, remaining stock of old livestock breeds were found. More than 170 breeds and varieties were recorded. There cannot be any doubt, though, that there is a lot of



need for action. Data- and information management by the governmental side is unsatisfactory. Keeper's subsidies for *in-situ* conservation are only paid to a very limited extent as herd-books and registers are often missing.

The co-operation with different nature protection organisations with in the frame of the monitoring activities but also when networking with different stakeholders proved to be very fertile: together with WWF Greece, interested stakeholders could be motivated: the "Society for the Protection of Prespa" uses water buffaloes and possibly soon also the



recently discovered Prespa cattle to keep wetland areas open, in the "Marine Park Alonnisos", last remaining Sykia cattle may soon be used for grazing. Environmentalists in the surroundings of Agrinion gave hints on diverse breeds kept traditionally in oak forests, just to give a few examples.

Furthermore, first steps for a standardisation of goats could be started and the topic of the fast decreasing stock number of donkeys could be discussed.



To prepare sustainable conservation work, networking of responsible bodies was, besides the recording of the present situation, a priority issue. The private sector (experts, keepers, interested public) is, like in most Southern European countries, weak. Networking was therefore very important. Mutual exchange strengthens the self consciousness when dealing with officials, initiates exchange of experiences and supports the dialogue of the rural and the urban population.

As already reported in SAVE eNews 2/2006, interested stakeholders founded the national NGO "Amalthia", the "Greek society for the conservation of indigenous breeds and domestic animals" on the 19<sup>th</sup> May 2006. Meanwhile, Amalthia has been approved by the governmental side as NGO and is listed as partner in the SAVE network. Its logo are the rounded horns of the Ulokeratiki goats, one of the most endangered goat breeds of Greece. With the support of the emergency fund, first animals could be bought and trans-



ferred to safeguard them and to set up conservation breeding (e.g. of the endangered Rodopi cattle). SAVE is very pleased to have met engaged and active partners in the members of Amalthia.

It is now necessary to verify the discovered diversity, initiate appropriate measure where necessary and win the broad Greek public for the issues of agro-biodiversity conservation. Further strategies for future development are the development of demonstration farms as "rescue centers", closely linked to nature protection areas, the set-up and support of breeders' organisations, breeders' meetings and set-up of herd-books. Animal shows should give the broad public the opportunity to experience their living cultural heritage. Breeders and keepers, on the other side, are strengthened through these activities. Cross-border co-operation and product marketing are also on the list of future strategies.

## Underutilized Plants for food, nutrition, income and sustainable development

Underutilized plants are species with under-exploited potential for contributing to food security and nutrition by combating 'hidden hunger' caused by micronutrient deficiencies; they often have medicinal properties and other multiple uses; they provide options for improved incomes to the poor, and for environmental services to the global community. These species collectively receive little attention from research, extension services, farmers, policy and decision makers, donors, technology providers and consumers. That's why the Global Facilitation Unit for Underutilized Species in Maccarese-Rome (et altera) plans an **International Symposium** at 3-7 March 2008 in Arusha, Tanzania.
